

# **STREETSCAPE PROJECT UPDATE AS OF**

**Monday, July 20, 2020**

The construction work on the streetscape project has been temporarily suspended due to potential COVID-19 exposure. The included statement provided by Vannoy Construction provides the information available at this time.

Vannoy Construction is committed to keeping everyone on its projects informed of potential exposure to Covid-19. Unfortunately, we have discovered a potential exposure to employees working on the Sparta project.

Friday afternoon we learned that one of our employees has tested positive for COVID-19. The employee who tested positive was last on a jobsite that may have resulted in exposure was on 7/8/2020. At the time we were informed of the positive test result Vannoy had already completed work on the project for the week.

Due to this potential exposure, Vannoy will keep the (Sparta) project shut down next week while we assess/monitor the health of everyone who might have been exposed. We plan to reopen the project on Monday, July 27, 2020, as long as we feel that it is safe for us to do so at that time.

In the meantime, we urge everyone who was on-site Thursday or Friday of last week to monitor your health closely for the next two weeks, check your temperature every day, and get tested for Covid-19 if you experience a fever or any other flu-like symptoms. In addition, we recommend a minimum two-week self-quarantine to anyone who was directly exposed to any Vannoy (employee) on the jobsite last week or that has tested positive for COVID-19 since.
